**REQUEST FOR URGENT CONFIDENTIAL BUSINESS RELATIONSHIP OF THE
TRANSFER OF ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY THOUSAND POUNDS UK STERLING
ONLY**

I hope this, letter will not embarrass you since we have not had any previous communication. I got your reference from your organisation's website under private enquiry that is not related to my aim of writing you this letter and went further to have it confirmed by the Football Association of England. I, on behalf of my colleagues from Boston United FC Football Club, decided to solicit your assistance as regards the transfer of the above stated amount into our nominated bank account. This fund arose from the contracts awarded to member clubs of the Football League some time ago.

The Football League has cited, as its reason for this foolhardy action, our failure to adhere to rules and regulations governing the full and proper payment of football creditors. But we say, the rules should not apply to us. If £130,000, we, are not to be compensated, how can one guarantee full compliance with the terms of the full debt for which we are liable?

We are, therefore seeking your assistance, Sir Mawhahaw, based on the balance amount of £130,000, which we are hoping can be speedily processed and fully remitted into our nominated bank account. On successful remittance of the fund into our account, you will be compensated with 25% of the amount, for assistance, and services, and 5% set aside for expenses contingency.

This transaction is closely knitted and in view of our SENSITIVE POSITION we cannot afford a slip, I assure you that this transaction is 100% risk free. We will avail you with our identities as regards our respective offices, when relationship is fully established and smooth operation commences. Please note that the DEAL needs utmost confidentiality and your immediate response will be highly appreciated and we will use our own share of the money to buy a full-back from Southport.
